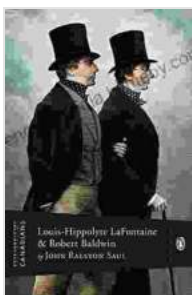


Extraordinary Canadians: Louis Hippolyte Lafontaine and Robert Baldwin

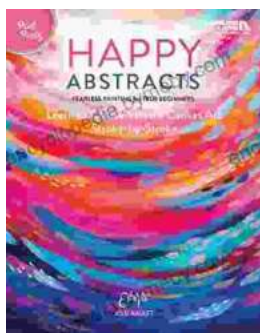
