





Hidden Gems


These are films that may have flown under the radar upon their release, but have since gained cult followings or critical acclaim:



- **City of God (2002)**: Fernando Meirelles' powerful and visually stunning drama about life in a Rio de Janeiro favela.




- **Amelie (2001)**: Jean-Pierre Jeunet's charming and whimsical romantic comedy about a young woman who sets out to improve the lives of others.




- **Parasite (2019)**: Bong Joon-ho's Oscar-winning satire about a poor family who infiltrates a wealthy household.

Documentaries


For those who crave something more thought-provoking or educational, documentaries offer a unique window into the world:



- **Citizenfour (2014)**: Laura Poitras' gripping account of Edward Snowden's revelations about the NSA's surveillance program.






